We are here for you and for your aging loved one, and our staff is dedicated to keeping residents and our team healthy and safe. We received substantial compliance and complimentary reviews of our team in our June 2020 Infection Control Survey from the Ohio Department of Health.

In response to the growing number of older adults experiencing abuse, we launched an Elder Justice Center that provides safe, temporary housing and connection to support services for victims of abuse, violence, trauma or criminal victimization.

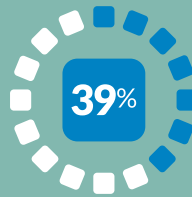
